Services in Honor of the Holy Theotokos before the National Election: “Many people are very concerned about the direction our Republic and about the rapidly approaching election in November of 2024. I am mandating that every parish have a public service in honor of the Blessed Theotokos every day in October asking for God’s blessings on our country in this election.” -Bishop Kurt, September 26, 2024. Following this instruction, I am scheduling the Praying of the Moleben to the Holy Theotokos every Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday morning, and the praying of the Akathist to the Holy Theotokos every Wednesday evening during the month of October. “Thank you for already singing ‘Beneath Your Compassion’ at the end of every service. God has shown great mercy to our Church in these difficult times. I have no doubt it is because of the fervent, persistent prayers of all the people.” Beginning this Sunday, this hymn will be sung at the end of every Liturgy, beyond October. I beg your personal prayers for our country and this election, national, state and local.
